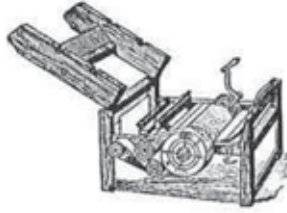


# Midway Gin & Grain Co-Op



To Whom It Concerns:

Here at Midway Gin & Grain Co-Op we were having several issues with our chain on all our equipment in the gin. The biggest and most costly problem was the chain expanding from heat. It was not unusual for the chain to stretch far enough to touch to the floor when running on hot day, that's about 2-3 feet of slack! Combine that much slack with processing cotton and several more issues come up. The cotton would stick to the chain causing it bind up or come off the sprocket. Both situations cause down time and costly repairs, neither of which we can afford during a busy a cotton season. Toward the end of the season in 2011 we started using Primrose's 548 Chain and Cable Lubricant. We applied it before leaving the gin one night like Sean said to do and then came in the next day to clean off any excess. The chain was left with a fine film of the shiny green lubricant making it look new. The real results came after running the first day. At mid-day, when the chain was usually already dragging on the floor, our chain was as tight as if not tighter than when we started up that morning. The lubricant penetrates the metal, guarding it from heat, dirt, grain or anything else while also removing the heat. Primrose's Chain and Cable lube is by the best chain lubricant we have ever used and has solved many issues for us at the gin. I would highly recommend this and any other Primrose products. We are now currently using several Primrose products including:
